Parking The main entrance and parking area is at the Sherman Avenue entrance, a few steps from the Sherman Avenue Bridge. Likewise, with the exception of the Shawnee Auto Club vintage car exhibit, flower beds and activities are located toward the Sherman Avenue end of the site.

Convenient parking is located at the Sherman Avenue Playground lot, directly across the street from our entrance, the Clark County Recycling Center lot, just across the bridge (north side of Sherman) and HBG's large Phase Seven area, also just across the bridge (south side of Sherman). Visitors may also park on nearby streets. Golf cart service is available for visitors with mobility concerns.
